

Proposed AMC Deployable Contracting Cadre Program

- Establish CONUS based Cadre of deployable 1102s**
- Centralized management for deployable civilians**
- Standard incentives**
- Term limits for deployable personnel**
- Centralized training plan for deployable civilians, supervisors, and military personnel**

Benefits of Cadre

- **Provides complete visibility, control and accountability over all AMC Job Series 1102 deployments**
- **Only fully qualified personnel are deployed**
- **Less disruption to MSC/SRA missions**
- **Mitigates risk of future mission failure**

Types of Work

- **Small Purchases for supplies and services from local vendors or US vendors**
- **Contracts for continuing services/supplies**
 - **Trash, portalets**
 - **Copiers**
- **Construction projects including Humanitarian Assistance**
- **If deploying to Honduras/GTMO – installation support**
- **If deploying to SWA – may include reconstruction and stabilization projects**

Types of Contracts

- **Primarily small purchases**
- **Construction projects**
- **Service contracts**
- **Supply contracts**
- **IDIQ contracts**
- **Basic Ordering Agreements**
- **Use of SF 44s with paying agent**

- **CAN BE LARGE CONTRACTS IN SUPPORT OF RECONSTRUCTION EFFORTS**

Duties and Responsibilities

- **Warranted Contingency Contracting Officer (Usually \$200K warrant)**
- **Write and sign contracts**
- **Advise customers on options for contract types and best ways to meet requirements**

Living Conditions

- **Field conditions prevail**
- **Barracks or tent structures**
- **Community bathrooms**
- **Dining facilities or MREs**
- **DCU/BDUs required for most locations**
- **Weapon recommended for some locations**
- **Some MWR facilities (gym, movies, books)**

Office Conditions

- **Computers in the office**
- **Usually internet access (depends on communication lines)**
- **Purple organization**
 - **Other military**
 - **Local contractor employees**
 - **DA Civilians**



KABUL OFFICE

- **OFFICE COMPOSITION**
 - 3 Contingency Contracting Officers
 - 1 Procurement NCOIC
 - 1 Host National Procurement Clerk
 - 1 Host National Interpreter
- **CONTRACTING ACTIONS (SEP 02-APR 03)**
 - Total Actions – 4,970 (Average 700+/- per month)
 - Total Dollars - \$21.3 Million (Average \$3M per month)
- **GEOGRAPHICAL SUPPORT**

**50% of the office mission is outside the immediate
Kabul area, in remote regions of Afghanistan**

CONTINGENCY CONTRACTING MISSION in AFGHANISTAN

- Provide contracting support to United States and Coalition Forces operating throughout the country of Afghanistan
- Provide contracting for Overseas Humanitarian Disaster and Civic Aid (OHDACA) to support the “Winning of Hearts and Minds of the Afghan People” and the reconstruction efforts
- Provide contracting for the Rebuilding, Training, Deployment, and Support to the New Afghanistan National Army (ANA)

ORGANIZATIONS SUPPORTED

- Combined Joint Civil Military Operations Task Force (C/JCMOTF) (450th CA BDE and 360th CA BN)
- Office of Military Cooperation – Afghanistan (OMC-A)
- Elements of 3rd/19th/20th Special Forces Group Airborne
- DOD Elements
- Other US Government Agencies including US Embassy

CONTINGENCY CONTRACTING MISSIONS

- CONTRACTING ACTIONS-
 - Construction – New and Reconstruction of barracks and Military and Civilian infrastructure facilities
Included hospitals, clinics, schools, wells, and bridges
 - Supplies – Includes trucks, Generators, Furniture, bedding, school kits, and wood stoves
 - Services – Food Service, Fuel, Water, Power Generation, And Leased Vehicles
 - Field Ordering Officer(FOO) Program – Train and supervise 84+ FOOs performing local buys
