

**DEPARTMENT OF ARMY  
ACQUISITION, LOGISTICS AND TECHNOLOGY (AL&T) NONCOMMISSIONED  
OFFICER (NCO) MINIMUM GENERAL TECHNICAL (GT) SCORE REQUIREMENT  
POLICY AND PROCEDURES**

1. **REFERENCE:** Department of the Army (DA) Pamphlet 611-21, Military Occupational Classification and Structure, 22 January 2007.
2. **DEFINITION:** General Technical (GT) Score – a composite GT score is derived from the Armed Services Vocational Ability Battery (ASVAB), and more specifically, by the subsets of arithmetic reasoning and verbal expression.
3. **APPLICABILITY:** This document applies to all Army AL&T 51C NCOs.
4. **PURPOSE:** This document establishes the policy and provides the rationale for granting an exemption to NCOs already serving in the MOS who do not meet the minimum requirement of a GT score of 110.
5. **BACKGROUND:** The U.S. Army Acquisition Support Center (USAASC) introduced the Career Management Field (CMF) and Military Occupational Specialty (MOS) 51C – AL&T Contracting NCO into the full spectrum Army in 2006. The primary objective of the Army Enlisted Acquisition CMF 51 and MOS 51C is to ensure that the Army has Contracting NCOs who are qualified, trained, experienced, and available to maintain a high state of combat readiness. When CMF 51 and MOS 51C were first introduced in December 2006, some NCOs were serving as procurement NCOs with GT scores less than 110. With the establishment of the MOS, those Soldiers already serving as Procurement NCOs were reclassified into MOS 51C with GT scores less than 110. When MOS 51C was added to the DA Pamphlet 611-21, it required a minimum GT score of 110. The last NCO reclassification into MOS 51C with a GT score less than 110 occurred in June 2009.
6. **RESPONSIBILITIES:**
  - a. Deputy Director, Acquisition Career Management (DDACM). The DDACM manages the accession, training, education and career development of AL&T workforce members.
  - b. U.S. Army Acquisition Support Center (USAASC). The USAASC Functional Area 51C Proponent Officer and CMF 51 Proponent NCO are responsible for ensuring all NCOs who submit reclassification packets have a minimum GT score of 110 or they will not be considered.
  - c. AL&T 51C NCOs. NCOs granted these GT score exemptions are encouraged to raise their GT score by taking the Functional Academic Skills Training (FAST) course at their installation education office.

**7. POLICY:**

a. GT score exemption. Soldiers currently reclassified and serving as 51C AL&T Contracting NCOs as of June 2009 are exempt from the minimum GT score requirement. This exemption allows those 51C NCOs with GT scores less than 110 to continue to serve and have the ability to reenlist in this MOS if eligible.

b. All newly reclassified 51C NCOs will be required to have a GT score of 110 or higher.

**8. EFFECTIVE DATE AND IMPLEMENTATION.** The policy and procedures are effective immediately and will remain in effect until superseded.
