SUBJECT: Elimination of Mobility Agreement Policy for the Civilian Army Acquisition Corps (AAC)

Reference:

Memorandum, SFAE-CM, May 8, 2006, subject: Elimination of Mobility Agreement Policy for the Civilian Army Acquisition Corps (AAC) (hereby canceled).

To ensure uniformity in its application, I direct that all executed civilian AAC Mobility Agreements, with exceptions listed below, be cancelled effective immediately.

Exceptions that will still require signed mobility agreements are: Acquisition Senior Executive Service positions, civilians occupying Central Select List positions, civilians occupying Key Leadership Positions and the Competitive Development Group/Army Acquisition Fellowship Program candidates. Existing mobility agreements for the exception categories remain in effect. If not presently in place, mobility agreements should be executed immediately. This change in policy does not affect military AAC members.

A mobility agreement requirement provides a stimulus for AAC workforce members to set their sights on increased responsibilities and leadership positions. However, even though there is no longer a mobility agreement requirement except for those positions designated above, I strongly encourage the rest of the AAC workforce members to voluntarily take the necessary steps to obtain the diversity of experience that a mobility requirement is intended to achieve. This valuable experience can only be gained by functional, organizational and geographical mobility that increases proficiency in one's acquisition career field and provides opportunities for career-broadening and developmental experiences and progression commensurate with one's abilities. I encourage the AAC senior leadership to mentor their employees to seek out diverse career enhancing opportunities.
